#### **COSAC Application Proccess**

COSAC is a recommendation body; therefore, the process should help applications narrow and meet the county's goals to allow the County Council to make informed decisions on applications that have had proper review and vetting.

- Pre-Application Meeting
  - Applicant may request a pre-application meeting with COSAC to receive initial feedback.
- Preliminary Application and Presentation
  - Review by COSAC and ranking
    - Applicant needs a general idea of how the Open Space Land will be used
    - Site Visit
    - Discussion about scoring in a public meeting
    - Fill in the scoring criteria
    - Provide initial review and recommendation to the applicant based on the preliminary application.
- Applicant updates application based on feedback from COSAC and gathers more detail on the following:
  - Longterm use of property
  - Appraisal
  - Funding request
  - Matching grants
  - Ownership
  - Longterm stewardship
- Second Round Application
  - Applicant submits a more detailed plan
  - Funding Plan Required
    - How much of COSAC Money is being requested
    - Other Funding Sources
    - Appraisal of the property
  - Another Site Visit
  - Applicant's Presentation
  - COSAC scores the property based on the specified use. This will require a more detailed scoring sheet for each primary proposed use.
    - Wilderness
    - Farm Land
    - Trails/Public Access Land
    - A combination

- Etc
- o Recommendation to the County Council
  - Approval of application
  - Approval with conditions
    - Secure additional funding
    - Finetune the application in specific ways
  - Denial
- County Council Review
  - o The County Council will review the application and make the final decision
