#### OPENING REMARKS AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Council member Tidwell gave the opening remarks and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE: CRAIG "W" BUTTARS

**APPOINTMENTS:** Mark Williams

Avon Cemetery District Board of Trustees

ACTION: Motion by Council member White to approve the recommended appointment. Zilles seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

#### OTHER ITEMS:

**Financial Statements** for March 2020 were presented.

(Attachment 1)

- □ COVID-19 Update Executive Buttars indicated the Governor announced there will be a lessening of COVID-19 restrictions as of Friday, May 1, 2020, from a category red (high) to category orange (moderate). Cache County will open some restaurants with revised seating of tables ten feet apart; the maximum number of individuals allowed in a group will be twenty (20) instead of ten (10) and the Health Department is tasked with further defining any changes on a local level. Monitoring will continue and this may move back to a category red if cases increase or to a category yellow if Cache County maintains or reduces the current level of COVID-19 cases. Executive Buttars will hold a Department Heads meeting tomorrow to determine when Cache County will open the building to the public. Masks will be provided for county employees.
- New operations center for the Road Department Construction is progressing and Executive Buttars asked if the Council is interested in a tour within the next week or two. Council members responded they would like a tour. Buttars will schedule it.

#### PUBLIC HEARINGS, APPEALS AND BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MATTERS

ACTION: Motion by Council member White to convene as a Board of Equalization. Worthen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

#### THE COUNCIL CONVENED AS A BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

- Property Tax Exemption Requests Findings and Determination:
- o IHC Health Services, Inc. for Logan Regional Hospital Chairman Ward has reservations about the charitable donations claimed by IHC. Council member Erickson asked if the donated portion is IHC's billed amount or the allowed billing by the average insurance company. Council member White said it is billable services allowed by Medicare. Vice Chair Worthen and Council member Borup said IHC's donation is within the rules for allowing of a tax exemption.
- o Community Nursing Services

ACTION: Motion by Council member Zilles to approve the property tax exemption requests for IHC Health Services, Inc. for Logan Regional Hospital and Community Nursing Services. Borup seconded the motion. The motion passed, 6 aye – Borup, Erickson, Tidwell, White, Worthen & Zilles and 1 nay – Ward.

 Corporation of the Episcopal Church – Chairman Ward noted the recommendation is to approve the exemption for the church (06-0018-0037) and deny the exemption for the Champ House (06-0018-0001).

Vice Chair Worthen concurred with the recommendation and stated this is not based on whether the Council thinks these are good people doing good things or not. It is based on the fact it is rentable property and should be taxed and doesn't qualify under what the law says.

Attorney Luthy stated he reviewed last year's denial based on the fact that Summerfest does not give the requisite gift to the community. It is a good organization, but does not meet the standard. That denial has been appealed and is awaiting a decision. He

thinks the county should hold to its position based on the fact that the present tenant, Logan Pride Foundation, may not meet the standard for gift to the community as it did not provide enough information to the county to quality.

ACTION: Motion by Council member White to approve the property tax exemption request for the Episcopal Church building, and deny the property tax exemption request for the Champ House. Erickson seconded the motion. The motion passed, 6 aye – Erickson, Tidwell, Ward, White, Worthen & Zilles and 1 nay – Borup.

ACTION: Motion by Vice Chair Worthen to adjourn from the Board of Equalization. White seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

THE COUNCIL ADJOURNED FROM THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.

#### **Council Member Reports**

Cache County Council 04-28-2020

<u>Barbara Tidwell</u> said the RAPZ/Restaurant Committee has had its first meeting with another scheduled for Friday, May 1, 2020. They are cognizant of the fact that revenue will probably be much less next year because of closures and the canceling of so many events.

<u>Jon White</u> hopes the County Fair and Rodeo won't be canceled. He asked whether there will be a summer county employee party. Buttars said that has not been discussed. It may depend on whether the Aquatics Center is open or not.

**Gina Worthen** has serious concerns over the economic consequences of COVID-19.

Work has begun on 3100 North and should be done by August or before from 1200 East to 400 East streets.

The state Republican convention used a voting app she is impressed with.

<u>Dave Erickson</u> commented he liked the state Republican convention and felt more people were voting than in previous years.

He asked if Executive Buttars has heard any more about the Mayors getting together on the CCCOG funding distribution. Executive Buttars replied they have decided to put the money towards the county's Richmond project. Providence will be reapplying for their project in the coming funding cycle.

Erickson said Director Jensen's sales tax report was excellent, but he is not excited to see the next one because of COVID-19's effect on businesses. Executive Buttars observed, it may be better than we think because every time he drives by Lowe's, their parking lot is full.

Erickson hopes the Fair will not be canceled because the citizens will need a celebration by that time after all the COVID-19 restrictions.

<u>Paul Borup</u> thanked Director Jensen for the sales tax report and said the sales tax will likely drop and the county will need to be more conservative next year.

#### CACHE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2020 - 06

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CACHE COUNTY, UTAH, AMENDING SECTION 15.08.030 OF THE CACHE COUNTY CODE RELATING TO THE DEFINITION OF FIRE ACCESS ROAD

WHEREAS, the Cache County Council has adopted, with some revisions, the International Fire Code and incorporated it by reference into the Cache County Code; and

WHEREAS, the Cache County Council from time to time has made and may continue to make additional revisions to the International Fire Code as adopted in order to address the unique needs and circumstances of Cache County; and

WHEREAS, the Cache County Council finds that this ordinance is in the best interest of Cache County and its citizens,

NOW, THEREFORE, The County Legislative Body of Cache County ordains as follows:

#### SECTION 1:

Cache County Code section 15.08.030 is amended as follows:

The following sections of the international fire code are also hereby revised:

Section 101.1 Insert: Cache County for [name of jurisdiction].

Section 110.4 Insert: Class C misdemeanor for [specify offense].

Section 110.4 Insert: up to seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) for [amount].

Section 110.4 Insert: up to ninety days or [number of days].

Section 112.4 Insert: up to two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) for the first [amount] and up to seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) for the second [amount].

Section 503.2 Insert: Driveways are considered fire department access roads.

Section 507.2 Insert: A mobile water supply is approved for fire protection in Group R3 Occupancies when a water source meeting the required fire flow is not available. A mobile water supply is approved for fire protection in Group S Occupancies in Forest Recreation-40 Zones when a water source meeting the required fire flow is not available.



Appendix A: A101.1 Insert: The board of appeals established within the unincorporated portion of Cache County for the purpose of hearing applications for modification of the international fire code pursuant to the provisions of section 108 shall be the Cache County fire board.

#### SECTION 2:

#### PRIOR ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS, POLICIES AND ACTIONS SUPERSEDED

This ordinance amends and supersedes Chapter 8 of Title 15 of the Cache County Code, and all prior ordinances, resolutions, policies, and actions of the Cache County Council to the extent that the provisions of such prior ordinances, resolutions, policies, or actions are in conflict with this ordinance. In all other respects, such prior ordinances, resolutions, policies, and actions shall remain in full force and effect.

#### EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance takes effect 15 days following its passage and approval by the County Council.
